APOGEE - AT THE APEX



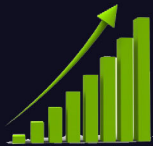
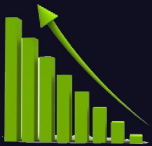

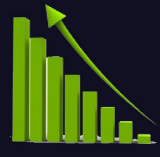


KEEPING GANDHI IN OUR HEARTS

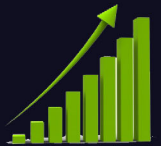
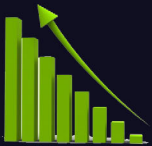
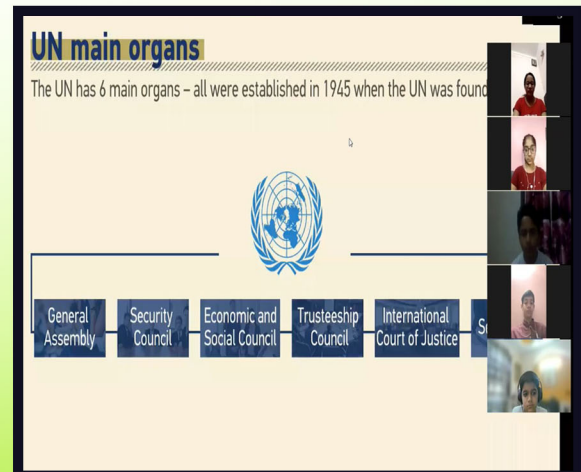


UNITED NATION'S DAY CELEBRATION

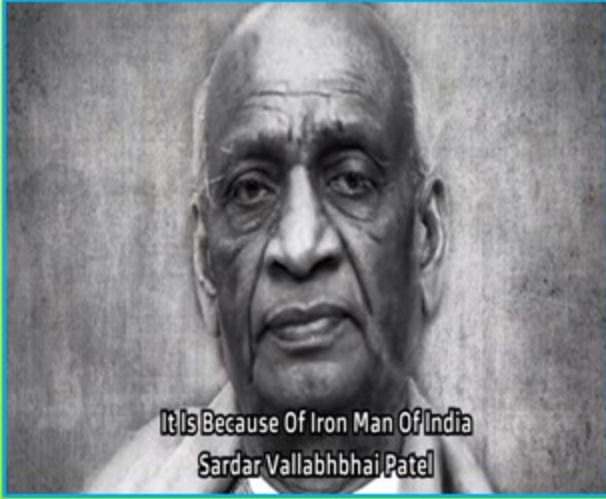


CELEBRATING THE IRONMAN OF INDIA

Signifying the depth of the event, a pledge on practising solidarity was also taken to infuse the core values in the hearts.



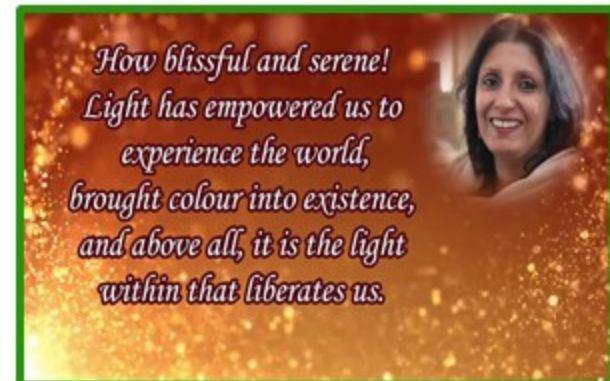


LIGHTING UP LIVES

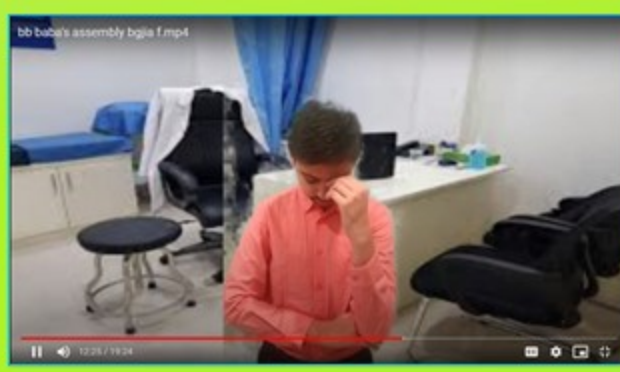
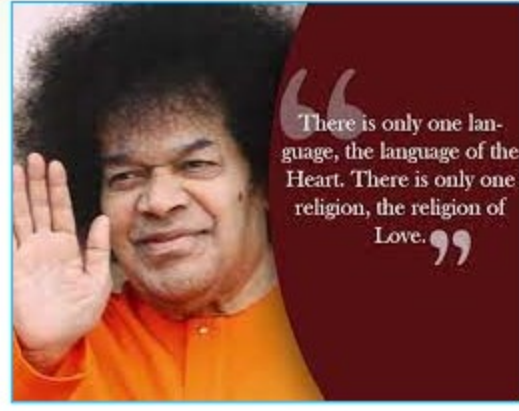
