GO GREEN GANESHA

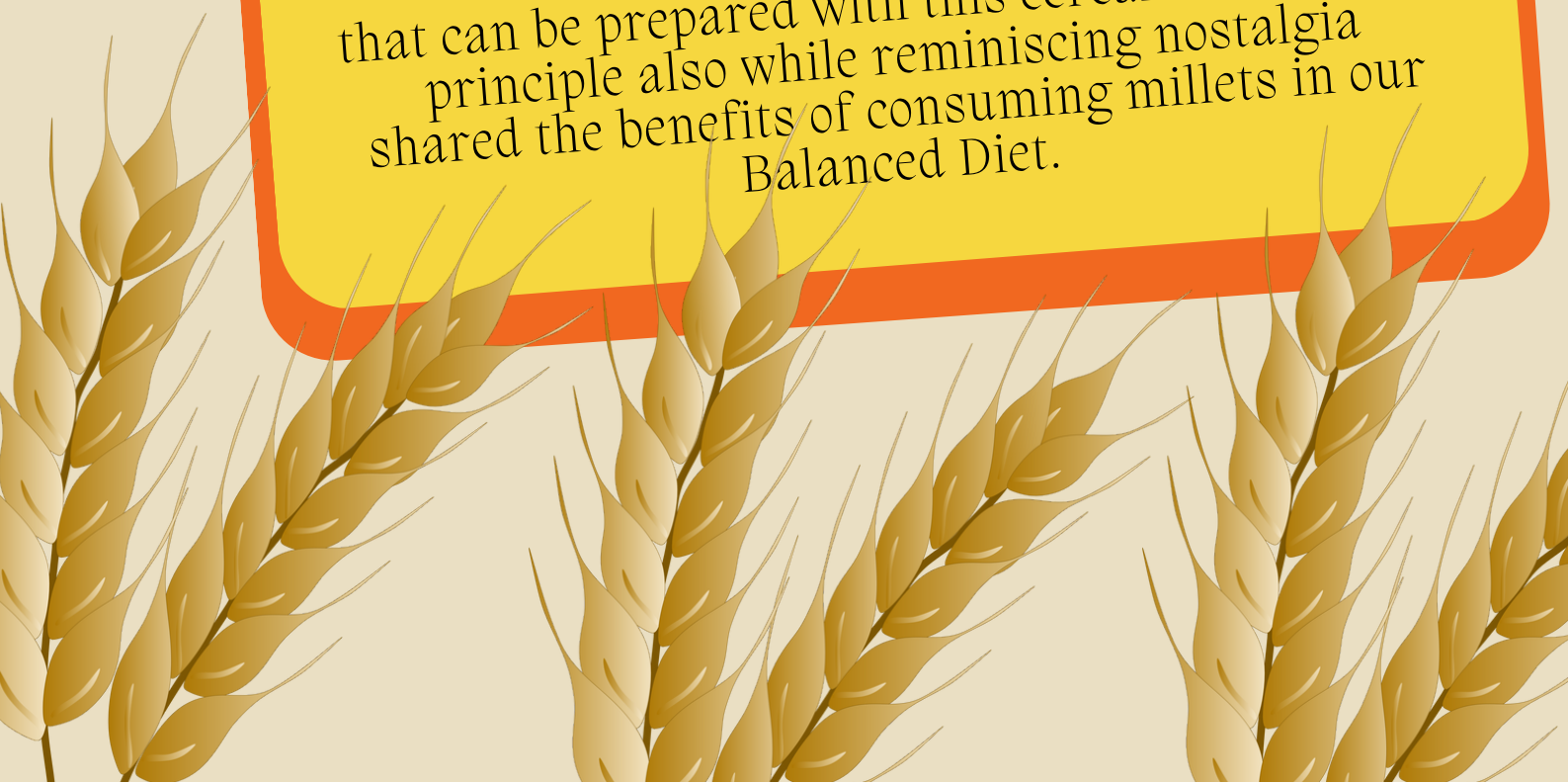
