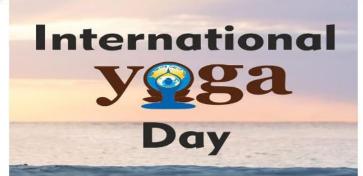
CELEBRATING THE SPIRIT OF A TEACHER - GURU PURNIMA

ALWAYS MAKING A STATEMENT-EXUBERANCE 2020



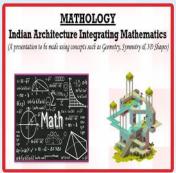

In the same event, Samriddhi Kapoor of class X, secured a consolation prize.















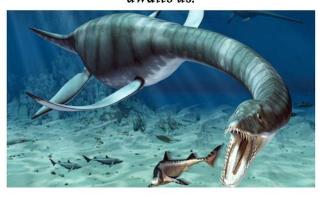


THE MYSTERY HEMISPHERE
